It is time for the 2023 Belmont County Junior Fair Feeder Calves to be registered and tagged. In order to be eligible for exhibition at the 2023 Junior Fair, *all Feeder Calves must be registered by June 15, 2023 with the OSU Extension office*. Late registrations are not permitted and will prevent Jr. Fair members from exhibiting and selling at the Belmont County Fair. Each youth may register and tag up to <u>FOUR Feeder Calves</u>, from which <u>TWO may be EXHIBITED</u> at the Belmont County Fair. All Feeder Calves may come from a home herd or be purchased outside the herd. Please note, all calves must be castrated and dehorned to exhibit.

Once the registration form is received, exhibitors will be able to pick up their ear tags at the Extension office. All Feeder Calf projects must be owned, in continual care and ear tagged with tags provided by the Belmont County Junior Fair by July 1, 2023. Following July 1st, random spot checks will be done to assure that animals are tagged properly up until the time of fair. Feeder Calves must be in the possession of the exhibitor by June 15, 2023. The animal's housing location must be declared on each of the respective registration forms. Animals must be under the care of the member and should be housed on the family's property. "Family" means the immediate family of an exhibitor, including but not limited to the exhibitor's parent, step-parent, foster parent, grandparent, step-grandparent, foster grandparent, brother, sister, step-brother, step-sister, half-brother, half-sister, son, daughter, step-son, step-daughter, or guardian. If a member is unable to keep their project animal on their property and do not have a "family" member that can keep their project animal, the member must complete a Housing Exception Form to be filled out and returned with the registration form. Each form will be considered by the Junior Fair Livestock Committee for approval. After each department's registration deadline date, random spot checks will be made by Senior Fair Board members and Junior Fair Livestock Committee members to assure that animals are tagged properly. Anyone knowingly switching or replacing animals after the possession date will be disqualified from showing or selling at the Belmont County Junior Fair during the current year. These random spot checks may occur until time of fair.

## **NEW REQUIREMENT FOR 2023:**

One (1) photo of the tagged animal and exhibitor must be uploaded into 4-H Online by July 2, 2023. The image MUST be clear, unobstructed, and include the exhibitors face, tagged animal and tag number. Additional details will be given at tag pickup.

The registration form for your Feeder Calf project is enclosed. Please fill it out and return it to the OSU Extension office by June 15, 2023. Exhibitors may register and tag up to 4 Feeder Calfs, from which a maximum of 2 may be exhibited at the fair.
