There are 27 project area categories in which to apply, such as individual animal projects, citizenship, community service, clothing, woodworking, leadership, and much more! Completing this record allows the member to be considered for a state award in that project area, and if chosen, presents an opportunity to participate in National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia! Beyond these state awards, members can be selected as county delegates to different state trips, camps, and other opportunities.

Ohio 4-H Achievement Record



The gateway to state and national 4-H opportunities, trips, and experiences!

The Ohio 4-H Achievement Record is a comprehensive record of a 4-H member's career, accomplishments, and achievements. It is a great way to capture all the experiences they have had in 4-H, practice for filling out future job or college applications, and get a head start on applying for scholarships.

There are 27 project area categories in which to apply, such as individual animal projects, citizenship, community service, clothing, creative arts, woodworking, shooting sports, leadership, and more! 4-H members can submit multiple achievement records in different categories based on their 4-H involvement. State winners in each category win a trip to events such as National 4-H Congress, National Dairy Conference and the Shooting Sports Teen Leadership Institute. These events encourage members to expand their skills, engage with other 4-H members, and inspire them to make an impact in their communities!

How do I get started?

Start by filling out the Achievement Record. The Ohio 4-H Achievement record can be found at ohio4h.org/awardsandscholarships. Sections include 4-H project work, 4-H participation, major 4-H honors, 4-H community service and citizenship activities, 4-H educational leadership, office and committee leadership, and non-4-H experiences, in addition to a written 4-H story and photo page reflecting on the member's 4-H experiences and impact.



1. Contact your county office

Contact your county 4-H professional for information about county deadlines, review process, and what local opportunities may be available through completing the achievement record!



2. Complete the Achievement Record

Complete all sections of the achievement record form. Be sure to follow the guidelines and show a cumulative record of your 4-H career! Applications can be tailored to the project area you are applying for.



3. Submit to your county office

Submit to your county 4-H professional by the deadline. State selections are made in February and state winners are notified in the spring.

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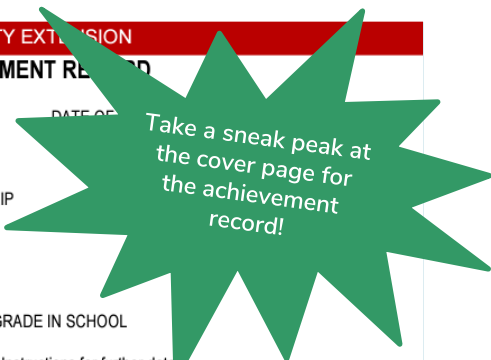

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Belmont County 2024 Enrollment

This document is intended to assist Belmont County 4-H families to enroll correctly for the 2023-2024 year.

CLOVERBUDS:

- All Cloverbuds should enroll in the 710 Cloverbud Activities project – AND NOTHING ELSE

PROJECT MEMBERS:

- Project members should ensure they are enrolling in the correct club and select at least one project to enroll in. See flyer for handy list of available projects!

VOLUNTEERS:

- Volunteers should ensure they are enrolling in their club(s) and updating their contact information as needed.
- Volunteers ALSO need to ensure they are selecting the correct volunteer type. See below for information.
 - ✓ Camp Volunteer – If your ONLY role is to be adult camp staff... choose this one!
 - ✓ Project Volunteer – NO ONE should choose this type. We mean it!
 - ✓ Program Volunteer – Volunteers that assist our county outside of a club setting should choose this option
 - ✓ Club Volunteer – ALL volunteers for ANY club should choose this option
