



All volunteers MUST complete training in order to be approved for the 2023-2024 program year. Returning volunteers are encouraged to attend the volunteer banquet and training on Nov. 4th, with a makeup date on Nov. 7th. New volunteers have trainings available on Jan. 17th and 20th.

Enrollment Opens

It's almost time for enrollment! The 2022-2023 Program Year will come to a close on October 31st. Enrollments will open November 2nd, but members and volunteers are encouraged to wait until November 6th to begin enrolling for the new program year as our staff works to prepare for the enrollment period once the program year rolls over. Volunteers needing Background Checks renewed this year will be notified in mid-October.

Animal Tag Pick Up

NEW PROCESS THIS YEAR***

All market steers, market feeder calves, market goats, market lambs, and market hogs will be moving to a self-tagging process for the 2024 fair. This process will include a registration and a tag pick up, followed by a photo verification requirement once the animal has been tagged. Registration and tagging will not have a weighin component before the fair. None of the above animals are to be brought to the fairgrounds prior to fair week. More details will be forthcoming as we approach the dates for this process.

WANTED: BELMONT COUNTY 4-H CARTEEN VOLUNTEERS

In CARTEENS programs, 4-H teen volunteers teach traffic education safety programs to first-time teen traffic offenders, while also building offenders' self-esteem and interpersonal skills. Teen traffic offenders attending this program have typically been cited for speeding, stop sign violations, reckless operation, and other, similar moving violations. CARTEENS program topics include excessive speed, driving under the influence, seat belt safety use, consequences of unsafe decisions, dealing with peer pressure, understanding traffic laws, and recognizing and reacting to traffic signs and signals.

Ohio 4-H CARTEENS has proven to be a valuable tool in educating Ohio's teen drivers and saving lives on Ohio roads. In addition, communities are strengthened by bringing together teens and adults representing local agencies and organizations that are working to address this need. Teens also gain leadership, public speaking, and organizational skills.

BELMONT COUNTY 4-H TEEN AMBASSADORS

The Belmont County 4-H Teen Ambassadors is a countywide group of 4-H teens that provides a youth stakeholder perspective in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of Belmont County 4-H programming. In this process, Ambassadors develop knowledge, skills, attitudes, and aspira-tions needed for future success. Ambassadors share advice and recommendations to 4-H professionals in order to improve, strengthen, and expand the county 4-H program. They serve as a sounding board for Belmont County 4-H Council.

SUBMIT TO THE OSU EXTENSION OFFICE BY OCTOBER 31, 2022

YOUR ROLE AND EXPECTATIONS IF SELECTED:

As a 4-H Teen Ambassador, you will be expected to participate in monthly meetings, which include the Belmont County 4-H Council meetings every other month. On the off months, you will meet with just the other Teen Ambassadors. Meetings will consist of the planning and implementation of various countywide 4-H events and opportunities. This will include but is not limited to project judging, 4-H promotions, community service projects and other planned activities.

Each year, the group will set goals to achieve in promoting the 4-H program to the greater community through planned activities.

Individuals must be 14-18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year for which they apply. Youth will be expected to apply annually for a one year term.

We will select up to 15 Teen Ambassadors each year. Please encourage your 4-H friends to apply!

The application process will take place in the fall, so that in November members will be selected and ready to begin work for the 2023-2024 4-H year.
